2	1. Analyze the process of providing psychological care for child and adolescents patients hospitalized in the psychiatric ward.	1 day, Inpatient ward
	2. Become familiar with the process of providing psychological care for child and adolescents patients who are not hospitalized (in community-based care or long-term care facilities).	1 day, Inpatient ward
